

Conditioning for RACQUETBALL 101

by Cheryl Gudinas

"What is the best workout to improve my racquetball game, besides playing racquetball?"

My answer always relates back to 1993, when I was fortunate to meet Scott Phelps. Scott was the Speed Coach for the Dallas Cowboys and Portland Trailblazers. He introduced all USA Racquetball Team members that year to the idea of Speed and Quick Feet. Upon implementing his workouts and drills, my game jumped up several levels almost immediately. Naturally, there was a lot of incentive to continue on with his workouts! So, I always tell players that, if I only had time for one type of workout aside from racquetball to improve my racquetball game, it would be "Speed, Explosiveness and Quickness."

This can include hundreds of exercises. My favorite is the footwork ladder, which combines coordination, quickness and concentration, all in one. I use the footwork ladder 2-3 times per week, for about 20 minutes each session.

The thing to remember when training for speed and quickness is that it is only beneficial if you aren't exhausted! So keep workouts short and sweet, allowing for time to recover between sets.

Other exercises to incorporate could include Ball Drops** (a Krystal Csuk favorite and Cheryl Gudinas not-so-favorite... they are brutal!), Star Drills (working on change of direction efficiency), line drills, and lateral movement drills.

It is important to remember that in racquetball we move in all directions, not just forward or side-to-side. Therefore, we should train similarly with forward and backward movements, diagonal movements and lateral movements.

Keeping it interesting and fresh is the key. Try to change your workouts every day to avoid boredom and keep your body in a state where it is forced to adapt and improve.

My upcoming Racquetball Clinic scheduled for September 24-26 will be focusing on this type of conditioning along with improving racquetball skills and strategies. For more information on this clinic, email me at unifiedfit@aol.com or give me a call at (630)308-2323.

***Editor's Note: Had to ask...what exactly is the dreaded Ball Drop? Cheryl replied, "To work on first-step explosion, a ball drop is where one person drops a ball from 5-8 feet away and the other has to explode, from receive-of-serve stance, and attempt to get to it before it bounces twice."*
