From the **PRESIDENT**

Happy Holidays! As I write this article, I am in between holiday parties. I have attended four this week so far and have some sort of event for the next five days in a row – and then it will be Christmas Eve. December is filled with opportunities to get together with friends and catch up as well as to celebrate the year that is about to end.

But what happens when the holidays are over? January can be cold and lonely. That's when SAD may occur. According to the Cleveland Clinic, *"Seasonal depression, often called seasonal affective disorder (SAD), is a depression that occurs each year at the same time, usually starting in fall or winter and ending in spring or early summer. It is more than just 'the winter blues' or 'cabin fever.'"*

Don't let SAD get you this year! In order to help you start the fight against the winter blahs and prepare for the State Doubles Championships, the Glass Court will host a one-day doubles warm-up on January 8th, three weeks before the Peoria event.

Then, grab your doubles partner and head for Peoria. The ISRA hosts the 2011 ISRA State Doubles Championships at Landmark Racquet & Health Club, January 28th-30th. Landmark is known for hosting great tournaments. In addition to the health club, the complex features a sports bar, bowling alley and a movie theater all under one roof. Three hotels have provided reduced rates for the weekend. The number of rooms is limited; book your room early to receive the tournament rate.

You'll find tournament information at www.illinoisracquetball.com or www.r2sports.com. Remember when signing up for either event – **Doubles teams must play at the level of the highest skilled player per ISRA eligibility.**

A new doubles rule also goes into effect on January 1, 2011. This rule will require you to keep your brain (further) engaged when playing doubles. USAR's Board of Directors has voted that a doubles team should be allowed to have either partner serve first each time the team comes "in" to serve and that an "out" should be assessed to the team if a partner who has lost the serve attempts to serve again during that inning. Here is the pertinent rule wording:

Rule 4.2 SERVE IN DOUBLES

(a) Order of Serve. At the beginning of each game, when the first server of the first team to serve is out, the team is out. After that, either partner can serve first each time the team steps in to serve. Both players on each team shall serve until there is a handout and a sideout — i.e. both players are out. The referee must make sure that neither partner serves again after that partner had previously lost a rally while serving.

Rule 4.4 OUT SERVE IN DOUBLES

(a) Out of Order Serve. If either partner serves again after that partner had previously lost a rally while serving, the penalty is an immediate out for that team.

The new rule changes go into effect January 1, 2011.

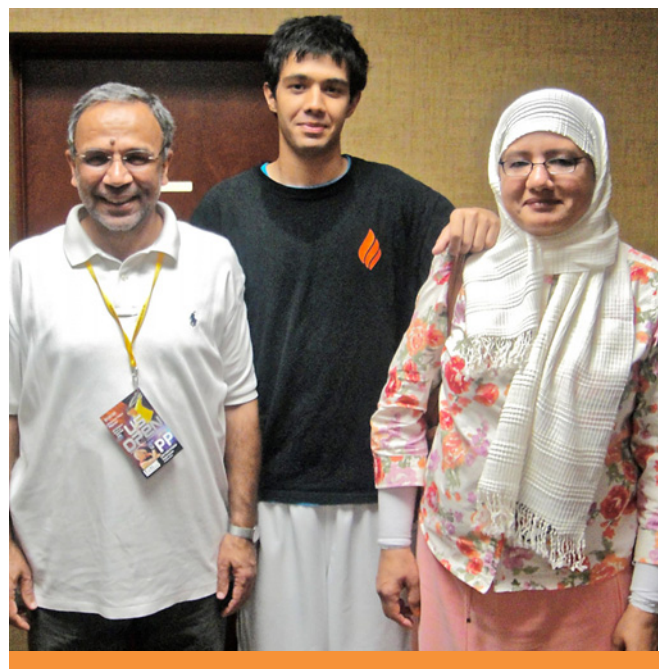

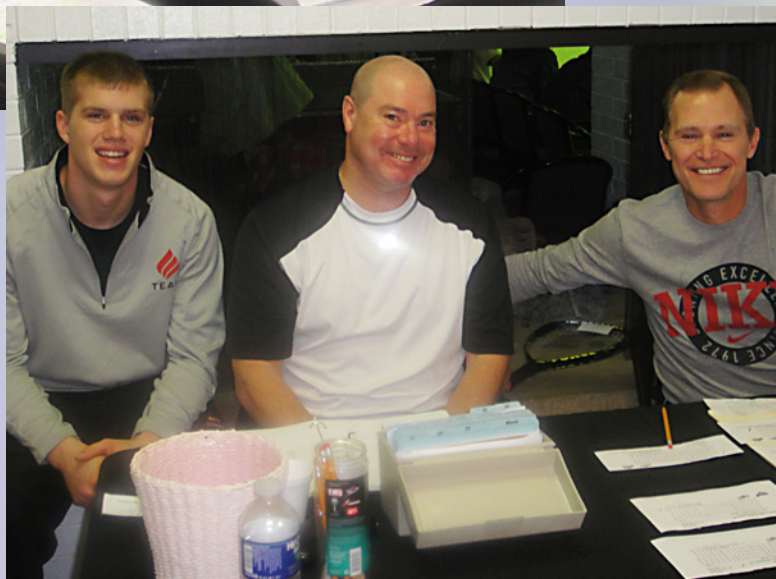

JTI MISSION STATEMENT

Junior Team Illinois (JTI) was founded by TJ Ferro and the ISRA for the purpose of teaching and promoting racquetball to junior players aged 6-18. JTI's goal is to develop character, skill and sportsmanship in young players, teaching the fundamentals of the game from an introductory to an advanced level and promoting safety on the court. JTI staff is comprised of volunteers, parents and advanced junior players.

2010 – 2011 Season

The season kicked off on November 7th at The Glass Court Swim & Fitness in Lombard, IL and runs through the last Sunday in February, but we will continue to work with juniors who wish to compete at a high level at the ISRA State Singles Championships scheduled for early April 2011. For a nominal membership fee, juniors receive two hours of coaching and court time on a weekly basis.

Our mission for this season is to spread the word to other clubs in Illinois. We are reaching out to assist interested clubs in creating a juniors program at their facilities.

Our suggested approach is a simple one. First, the club may want to hold a clinic to introduce the sport to a wide variety of ages. We have volunteers who are willing to help host a clinic.

Second (and most important) is that adult/parent leadership continues with the next step of the process: initiating a weekly two-hour session. This is when the juniors can come to learn and play the game. **ADULT/ PARENT INVOLVEMENT IS THE KEY TO A PROGRAM'S SUCCESS.** The successful youth program leaders in Oregon and Missouri stress this key element.

Large organizations such as Life Time Fitness have recognized the importance to their business of maintaining healthy adult and youth racquetball programs. Racquetball is

part of their vision for the future in their clubs nationwide.

There is a revenue stream for the club associated with junior racquetball activity. Depending upon the number of kids involved and the fee charged, it could become economically meaningful in the short- and long-term. Generally, court time is used during the off-peak court hours. As an example, Glass Court offers us their facility mid-afternoons on the weekends.

JTI is also working with sponsors/manufacturers to assist in providing equipment and promotional materials as needed.
