From the PRESIDENT

We have many deserving members of the Hall of Fame. Some were chosen based on playing ability, some based on dedication to junior racquetball and some based on promotion and support of the sport.

On Saturday, April 2, the "Pied Piper" of Illinois racquetball will be inducted into the Illinois State Racquetball Association Hall of Fame, and his contributions fall into *all* of those categories. Who is the "Pied Piper"? Who else but Dave Negrete!

I use the term "Pied Piper" to refer to Dave because he has an entourage...a following... some peeps...whichever term you prefer. When he and I worked on State tournaments together, he would put the word out and get an additional 15 or 20 players to enter the event.

Dave is a player, starting racquetball as a junior player and ending his competitive playing career as a top Open player. I remember watching Dave play several matches in Houston one year. I learned so much from watching him and then tried to incorporate those observations into my game. While at those tournaments, Dave often provided coaching assistance for Illinois players.

Dave is a teacher, too. He teaches juniors and all levels of adult players, both male and female. I have experienced



the impact of his teaching firsthand — in my opponents!

Dave has been a club manager, club owner, tournament director, USA Racquetball Board member and Commissioner of the IRT. He helped gain support for creation of the new all-Lucite court and brought to reality his vision for bringing the Pro Nationals to Schaumburg, and to Navy Pier, and also to an outdoor venue in Denver. Dave was a recipient of the coveted Joe Sobek Contributor Award in 2009 at National Singles.





What was your most memorable moment in racquetball?


Winning an A singles division in Peoria.
