From the PRESIDENT

"To downplay or misrepresent one's ability in a game or activity in order to deceive (someone)..." is one of the published definitions of "sandbagging."

Using that definition, is it sandbagging to play down a skill level when you go to a tournament outside of your geographic area where other players may not know you? Is it sandbagging to play down a level at a national tournament?

I sometimes hear that "they" say you should play down a level at the big tournaments. I always wonder who "they" are who say this. Some events have an "Elite" level for State Open players to participate in that will eliminate the necessity of playing against professional players. That seems fair. But is it fair for an Open player to drop down to the A division? Or for a B player to drop down to the C division? That probably leads to more wins for the player dropping down, but what does it do to the player who practices for the tournament, spends the money to get there, enters the proper division, and loses an opportunity to win?

I have never sandbagged in a tournament. I won an A tournament draw of 32 players many (many) years ago and moved up to Open. I have played Open or a straight Age group division in every tournament I have played since then. I can take getting pummeled by Chris Evon or Debbie Tisinger in an Open/Age division, but I don't think I could feel good about winning a division that I legitimately did not belong in. And, even worse, what if I lost?

Recently all USA Racquetball members received an article entitled *"Why Rules Matter."* The subject of the article was some new, longer racquets that have entered the marketplace but do not conform with the racquet rules for competitive play. To quote the opening paragraph of the article:

There is nothing more important to a sport than its rules. Rules ensure that



the sport played by one person is the same as that played by another. This simple dynamic allows for fair play.

Racquetball rules cannot be applied on a "one off" basis. The eligibility rule is as important as the racquet rules and the racquet rules are as important as the official size of the court, the ball specifications, the scoring rules, and so on, and so on, and so on. Maintain your integrity and the integrity of the game by playing by the rules.

As we enter the heart of our tournament season, here are some news tidbits:

- The above-mentioned racquets are ineligible for Travel League or Tournament play and will not be allowed
- Start tracking the progress of the competition now! It won't be long before we start asking for nominations for the ISRA Annual Awards
- Use the Tournament Calendar on page 22 to plan your weekends
- Thanks to Pam Schubach for her service on the ISRA Board of Directors. Pam's experience and insight has been welcome. She is retiring from the Board (at least for now) and will be missed!

And, thanks to Samuel Gomez for agreeing to take Pam's seat on the Board in order to continue representation for Central Illinois. Welcome, Sam!!

What Racquetball Means to Me

Age, hometown, occupation, years in racquetball, home club, and family?

I'm 48, live in Naperville, and my occupations are Personal Trainer, Vet Assistant, Pro Tour Player (32 years). I play out of Glass Court. Family is pretty much my mom Pat and my dad Bill, with cousins nearby, and Aunt Joy and Uncle Lou. Two doggies – Diego and Newman.

What influenced you to start playing racquetball?

I was in the choir freshman year. There was a senior in the a cappella choir that I found out worked at a club. I thought he was pretty cool, so I joined the club to hang around him. But he never knew who I was at all!

What are your goals in racquetball for this next season?

My goals include winning National Doubles with my partner Sharon Jackson and trying to win my ninth national title at National Singles, which no one has ever done. Rhonda (Rajsich) tied me last year with eight but there were only four or five girls the last two years in the division. This year the numbers will be up again because it has become an important national team qualifier, whereas last year it was not. I would consider winning it this year a real accomplishment with a full draw. Not to take away anything that anyone else has done, but all of my eight national titles were with full draws. There was maybe one year where I had a bye into the quarterfinals, but every other year I had to play at least four matches to win the whole thing.

What makes you love this sport?

It's really the training that I had to do to get to be #1. I really enjoyed that, and more importantly, I enjoyed winning so that I could show all the people who helped me that their assistance paid off. I miss my strength and conditioning coach, Tim Lang, who was there with me during my time as #1. Sadly, he's not training anymore. I miss the days of training with Tim at DePaul University. I'd give anything to go back to that time.

What is your philosophy on life?

To surround yourself with an excellent support system and to treat all living things with kindness and compassion. The one thing that I think everyone knows I'm about is loving animals, and there's just too much abuse and cruelty in the world. I strive to do the best I can to make that stop although I realize that it won't. But I would like to bring awareness to young children so that over time the world becomes a better place.



What was your most memorable moment(s) in racquetball?

Probably the two times I won the US Open, especially the first time in 2002. I also loved all of the national events in Houston. That became my home-away-from-home, and I miss it tremendously. Nationals has never been the same since we left Houston.

I also am very proud of my performance in the 2011 Pan American Games. I had a torn meniscus and knew that I was going to have surgery as soon as I got home. Coach Jim Hiser had it set up perfectly so that I could perform my best, and I ended up with a bronze medal after making it through a tough draw, ultimately losing to Paola Longoria.

What is one thing you would like to do that you have not done yet?

There are a lot of things that I'd like to do that I haven't done. I'd like to go back and get my Masters degree in Sports Leadership. I just have to put in the time. I'd like to take a nice non-racquetball vacation, something that I haven't done since 2002.

What else would you like your racquetball colleagues to know about you?

Being on the US National Team has always been my favorite thing in my career. I think it's safe to say that I played my heart out for the team more than anybody that I can remember, and I did it for the longest amount of time. That's something I'm very proud of, and I feel fairly confident that what I was able to accomplish over 22 years, consecutively, will be hard to beat. And it's not just the titles that I won but also the passion and heart that I put into it year after year for such a long time. This is my 23rd year on the team. I missed last year due to injury, and it was heartbreaking.

You're now the US Junior Team Head Coach. Thoughts?

I was sad that my best friend, Kelley Beane, had to step down last year as Head Coach. I thought about stepping down myself when she left but realized that I didn't want it to go into someone else's hands if I wasn't sure they would run it the way that Kelley ran it for 12 years. We created a dynamic where everybody we brought on board had the same values and taught the same way in terms of putting the athlete as a person first and the game second. In addition, there were no coaches ever working with us who were in it just to better their reputations as coaches. The philosophy on our staff has always been to make the kids better people, and prepared people, for life, not just to get them to win titles. Titles are secondary.

Junior Team Illinois (JTI)

The JTI 2015-16 season began Sunday, October 11, at Glass Court and will run through March. JTI Head Coach Marian Bala along with Andy Pitock and several assistants will be working with the group each week to teach fundamental racquetball skills.

Seventeen students aged 6-15 registered for the new season. One fee includes instruction, USA Racquetball membership, a JTI t-shirt, and a pizza party at the end of the season. The cost is \$85 for Glass Court members and \$150 for non-members. Students need a racquet, protective eyewear, court shoes, and a glove (if desired).

After registration and a brief parents' meeting on the 11th, players were assessed for their initial skill levels and divided into Beginner, Intermediate, and Advanced groups. They will meet each Sunday at 10 am, 11 am, and 12 pm, respectively.

International Update

Pan American Games

Toronto, Ontario, Canada

The Pan American Games are racquetball's most prestigious international competition. Established by the Pan American Sports Organization (PASO), the inaugural Games were held in Buenos Aires, Argentina in 1951 and it remains a major quadrennial sporting event in the Americas today.

Earlier in the year, 16 countries competed in the Pan American Racquetball Championships (PARC) in the

Dominican Republic, where 12 qualified to compete in Toronto: Argentina, Bolivia, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, Guatemala, Mexico, United States, and Venezuela. In total, 54 racquetball athletes made the journey to Toronto.



On arrival, athletes were escorted to a zoned Athletes' Village. In full service to the athletes and delegates, the Residential Zone was impressive in offering an Internet Cafe, lounge and meeting facilities, free-of-charge beverages via many conveniently placed coolers, concierge service, self-service laundry, Main Dining Hall (no charge), a multi-faith center, a polyclinic, transportation to competition venues, relaxation lounges and game



rooms, a 24-hour fitness center, and an 18-acre park.

The US Team consisted of Rocky Carson, Jake Bredenbeck, José Rojas, Jansen Allen, Rhonda Rajsich, Michelle Key, and Kim Russell-Waselenchuk. Dave Ellis and RO Carson coached the players. Team Illinois members Brent Huff (Athletic Trainer) and Cheryl Kirk (Team Leader) rounded out the support roster and stayed in the Athletes' Village with the team members and coaches.

It was a thrill to enter Hall C of the Exhibition Centre, Canada's largest facility for conventions, exhibitions and events, to be greeted by brand new portable racquetball courts that were primed to see their first action – ever! There was one all-glass show court as well as three match courts with panel walls and glass backs. Bleachers stretched across the back of the match courts and along the sides and back of the show court. (Once the Games were over, the courts were disassembled and then re-assembled at Racquetball Canada's new high performance facility in Regina, Saskatchewan. These courts were donated as a legacy from Toronto 2015.)

Pan Am Games Racquetball was actually three events in one, featuring two phases of individual competition followed by the team competition.

In successfully defending his Pan Am Games Gold Medal from 2011, Rocky Carson became the first man in Singles to win back-to-back Games. His two Pan Am Singles Gold Medals, combined with a record four World Championship titles, make him the most decorated man in the history of international racquetball.

The US Team finished the individual phase with two gold medals (Rocky Carson and the Men's Doubles team of Rojas and Allen) plus two bronze medals (Rhonda Rajsich and the doubles team of Rajsich and Russell-Waselenchuk). In the team competition, both the men's and women's teams captured silver.

An estimated 37,000 people were on hand to view the closing ceremonies show with Kanye West, Pitbull, and Serena Ryder at the Rogers Centre (home to the Toronto Blue Jays). The two-hour extravaganza featured a light show, fireworks, videos, dancers, and the Hamilton Children's Choir. A highlight of the ceremony was the passing of the PASO flag from the mayor of Toronto to the mayor of Lima, Peru, the site of the 2019 Pan American Games.




