



Fran Davis Racquetball Camp

The weekend of November 6-8, 2015, saw ten intrepid campers from four states converge on Glass Court for three days of racquetball instruction from Fran Davis, one of the game's premier coaches. Fran currently works with LPRT #1 and World Champion Paola Longoria and IRT #2 and 2015 Pan American Games gold medalist Rocky Carson. This was an opportunity for many local and regional players to learn from the best. Local teaching pros Andy Pitock and Marian Bala assisted during the classes and on-court instruction that began Friday evening and concluded on Sunday at noon with certificates of completion. Along the way, the class focused on stroke mechanics, shot selection, tournament preparation, and game strategy with multiple on-court sessions including video analysis that (frequently) pointed out the flaws (aka opportunities for improvement) in each player's game. Fran's camp has come to Glass Court annually for many years. All-in-all, a very worthwhile weekend that everyone who wants to improve their game should consider!

Fran will be bringing her camp back to Lombard in late October or early November. Check the ISRA website periodically for updates!

Charles "Chuck" Martarano

Ambassador to Racquetball | 1928-2016

Chuck Martarano was an ambassador to racquetball. He competed locally and nationally for many years before formal associations were formed, winning many titles along the way. For over 20 years Chuck ran a league of 16 pretty good players starting out at the Oak Park Court House, then moving to Melrose Park and ending up at Glass Court.

Chuck was not only an accomplished player but a mentor to many along the way, such as last year's inductee into the Hall of Fame, Billy Lyman.

The following story is told by Doug Peterson, a multiple State Champion:

"I had been playing racquetball for six months and thought I was pretty good. I went over to the Oak Park Courthouse and saw Chuck

playing. He saw me watching and invited me down to play. For the next hour he just ran me around the court until I could barely stand. I went back to my friends and told them that I just played a guy who must be the greatest player in the state. Chuck was a painter/wallpaper hanger by trade. Over the years Chuck helped by hiring more than a few friends who had lost their jobs. Chuck was a friend, mentor, and inspiration to many racquetball players."

During the 2015 Shamrock Shootout/IRT Tier 1 event, Chuck was honored by the ISRA and IRT as a great racquetball ambassador for over 50 years.

If there are any additional Director nominations, the President shall first verify that the nominee is in agreement to run and serve and shall give notice of said nomination to the public via the ISRA website and email communication on or before May 15 but in no case fewer than 30 days before the Annual Meeting date.

The election shall take place at the Annual Meeting in June, by ballot, with only members present voting. If there are no additional nominations, the Nominating Committee's slate shall be accepted automatically.

On Saturday, February 27, 2016, the Illinois State Racquetball Association held its 2016 Hall of Fame Induction and 2015/2016 Annual Awards Ceremony. It was held during the ISRA State Singles Racquetball Championships that were taking place at the Glass Court Swim & Fitness Club in Lombard, Illinois. The ceremony was conducted in the gymnasium and was emcee'd by ISRA President Laurel Davis.

Prior to the beginning of the ceremony, the three new inductees and their families were invited to dinner in the Glass Court's lounge. Afterward, everyone moved to the gymnasium and the ceremony was begun by recognizing the sponsors of the tournament: Anthony's Pizza (Tony Cosmano), Glass Court Swim & Fitness (Dan Jaskier & Joe DeArmas), Kirsten's Danish Bakery (Paul & Kirsten Jepsen), Little Debbie (Joe & Janet Eminger), Pro Penn, and Professional Insurance Producers (Nancy & Dave Kronenfeld). Junior player Matthew Gollins received the 2016 TJ Ferro Junior Scholarship Award. Matthew was present to accept his award and thanked his coaches, his parents, and the ISRA for choosing him as the recipient of this prestigious recognition.

A special award of gratitude was presented to Tony Cosmano for his outstanding contributions to the Illinois racquetball community.

The 2016 ISRA Hall of Fame inductees were David Milazzo, who has had a very lengthy and extraordinary career playing racquetball in the State of Illinois for 46 years and is still

Each inductee was introduced by an individual of their choosing and went on to deliver entertaining and inspiring comments about their racquetball careers.

WHAT *Racquetball* MEANS TO ME

Hometown: Chicago, IL

Occupation: Teacher Aide at Milne Grove Elementary School

Family: By way of foster care, I am raising and adopting four boys: Drayson, 5; Andres, 6; Dradyn, 7; and Jose, 8.

Years in racquetball: 10

Home club: Glass Court Swim & Fitness, Lombard, IL

What influenced you to start playing racquetball?

Growing up, I always saw myself as an Olympic track & field athlete, however my dreams were cut short in college as I didn't really understand how to pursue and accomplish that goal. Upon returning home from school, and wanting very much to continue in fitness, I began working at Bally Total Fitness where I met Martin Gonzalez, who as we all know is a phenomenal left-handed racquetball player. Daily he played racquetball on his lunch break and eventually introduced me to the game. I thought that this would be a great way for me to stay active and still cater to my competitive nature.

What are your goals in racquetball this year?

My word for 2016 is "consistency": in my daily routine, nutrition, workouts, lessons, and practicing. I believe consistency will take me to another level on the court, and hopefully my scores and results will reflect my improvement.

What makes you love this sport?

In 2006, after I stepped back from racquetball for some years to attempt to pursue running again, I came across footage of Rhonda Rajsich and Kerri Wachtel on racquetballonline.tv. IT. WAS. AMAZING! I said to myself, "I want to do that!" I had no idea that professional racquetball even existed. It was in that moment that I knew that racquetball was my sport, and I made the decision to do what I could to do it well.

What is your philosophy on life?

"But my life is worth nothing to me unless I use it for finishing the work assigned me by the Lord Jesus--the work of telling others the Good News about the wonderful grace of God." -Acts 20:24

What was your most memorable moment in racquetball?

In November 2006 I played in my very first tournament in Indiana at the Omni. I believe I signed up for the novice division where I lost 15-2, 15-0. At that moment I had a decision to make: quit or get better. The tournament director felt so bad for me that he introduced me to Carolyn Watkins so I could have a "shoulder to cry on." Well, Carolyn invited me to watch her match. She was a beast! I decided that I was going to find a coach and start



training. That memorable moment helped me make a decision and led me to begin training with Joe Silius who gave me a great foundation and, more importantly, believed in me. Then I had the honor of working with the great Cheryl Gudinas who taught me that this game is not only physical, it also takes mental toughness. Currently, Andy Pitock is consistently reminding me to set goals and that every time I step on the court, it is an opportunity to practice.

What is one thing you would like to do that you have not done yet?

In life, open a shelter/soup kitchen for homeless youth.

In racquetball, win the US Open Racquetball Championship, of course!

What else would you like your racquetball colleagues to know about you?

Racquetball has given me lifelong friendships and relationships with individuals from all walks of life that I might not have known otherwise. I learn from every person I am on the court with and always strive to be an example to those around me...a work in progress.

Over the past five years, I have had a hand in raising 26 foster children. I don't think I could have kept my sanity if not for racquetball. There are some with whom I've shared the highs and lows, the ups and downs, the struggles and the victories of this journey, and I am very appreciative of their friendship and support.

At the end of it all, the people are the reason I have remained in this sport. There is no other sport where we have such open access to pros and former pros where it's so easy to glean wisdom and knowledge. Grateful every day.

XXVII IRF World Junior Racquetball Championships



Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic November 5-15, 2015

Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic, was the site of the 2015 event that annually brings together junior players, this year from 15 countries representing North, Central, and South America, Europe, and Asia. Participating countries were Argentina, Bolivia, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, Guatemala, Honduras, Ireland, Korea, Mexico, Puerto Rico, and the United States. Players numbering 184 competed in the Championships.

The US Junior Team Delegation to this event included twenty-seven players, five staff members, and 33 parents/siblings/friends. Staff members included Team Illinois' Cheryl Gudinas (Head Coach) and Cheryl Kirk (Team Leader) along with Jody Nance (CA), Jen Meyer (CO), and Jeff Conine (FL).

FORMAT

The event features seven full days of competition in three main categories: World Cup (18-, 16-, and 14-), Esprit Cup (12- and 10-), and Challenger Cup (divisions for players who did not qualify for

their national teams). Boys and girls competed in both singles and doubles divisions. The event was divided into two portions; a three-day round robin format that determined seeding for the final four days of medals rounds.

At the US Junior Team camp at the USOC Training Center in Colorado Springs in August 2015, Sean Swarner, a motivational speaker, author, and founder of the non-profit organization, The CancerClimber Association, inspired our junior athletes with stories of his challenges and accomplishments against all odds. Sean, a friend of Assistant Coach Jeff Conine and a resident of Breckenridge, Colorado, decided to take his involvement one step further and flew to the Dominican Republic both to visit his dad who lives there and at the same time support the US Junior Team at Worlds. 


